2. **Critical and Creative Thinking:** Preparing for both roles required analysis, imagination, and the ability to interpret personalities from different angles.

4. **Research and Preparation:** For characters beyond the syllabus, students researched biographies and historical events, strengthening independent learning skills.
5. **Engagement and Enjoyment:** The activity broke the routine of traditional learning, making the classroom environment more interactive and enjoyable.

Results:

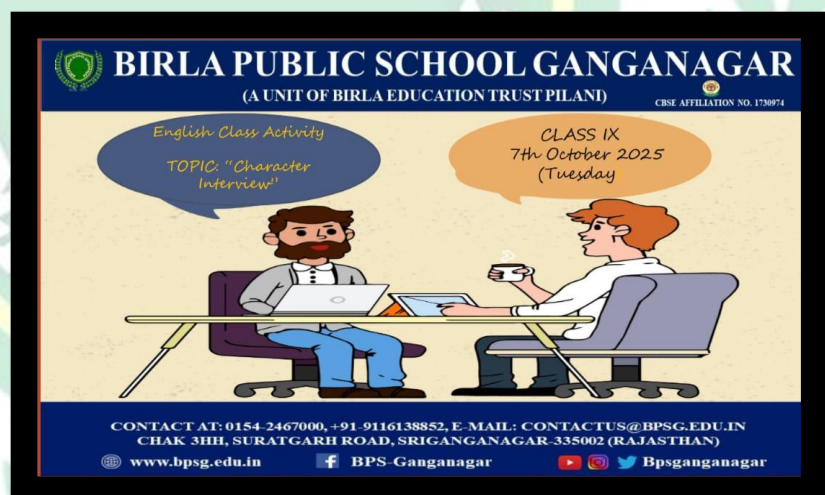
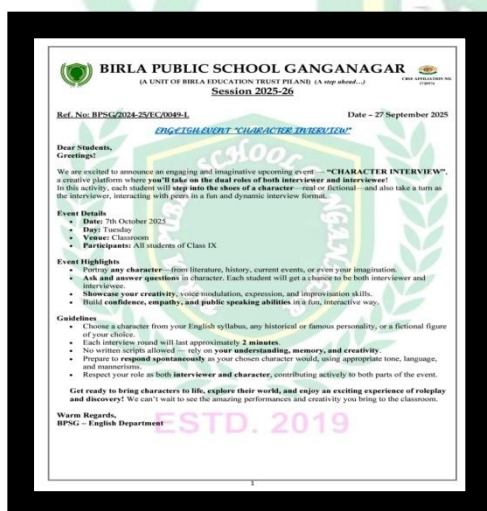
