From Classroom to Kyoto: Birla Public School, Sri Ganganagar Students Soar on International Horizons

Japan Educational Tour: A Remarkable Blend of Learning, Culture and Innovation

The journey commenced from Tokyo, the capital city of Japan, where students visited several renowned educational and cultural destinations:

- Miraikan - National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation: Students explored robotics, Artificial Intelligence (AI), and futuristic technologies through interactive exhibits and scientific demonstrations.
- Tokyo Rinkai Disaster Prevention Park: Here, students gained valuable knowledge about disaster management, emergency preparedness, and safety systems.
- Akihabara Electric Town: Students experienced Japan’s globally celebrated electronic culture and modern technological innovations.

During their visit to the Mount Fuji region, students admired the breath-taking natural beauty of Oshino Hakkai village. They also enjoyed scenic views through the Lake Kawaguchiko Cruise and the Mount Fuji Ropeway. One of the most exciting moments of the tour was the thrilling journey aboard Japan’s famous bullet train from Mishima to Osaka, which left the students amazed by its speed and efficiency.

To understand Japanese culture and traditions more deeply, the delegation visited Kyoto and Osaka:

- Senso-ji Temple and Kinkaku-ji: Students explored the magnificent ancient temples and gained insights into Japanese architecture and spirituality.
- Traditional Tea Ceremony at Koigokoro: Students participated in a traditional tea ceremony and learned about Japanese etiquette, discipline, and customs.
- Team Lab Bio vortex Kyoto: Students witnessed a fascinating blend of digital art, creativity, and innovation.
