Objective of the Activity:

Brief Note About the Activity:

By the end, learners should recognize Mesopotamia's lasting impact on civilization. They will also gain skills in observation, comparison, and expression. Most importantly, the activity aims to inspire interest in ancient cultures and how they shaped the world we live in today.

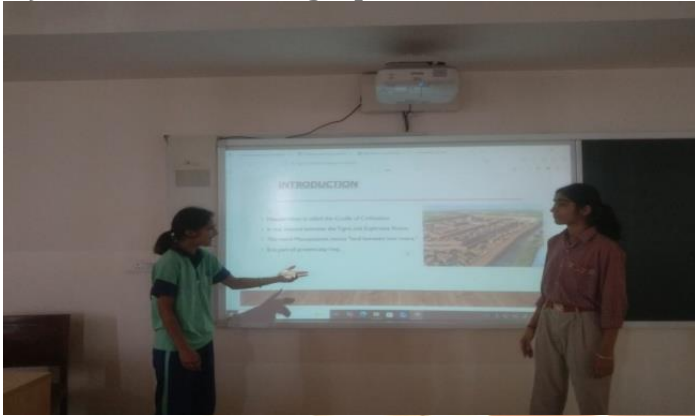
